From the Pastor's Desk

By now, all of you have likely heard the news that our long legal struggle is over. It did not end the way we hoped, or the way we believe would have been just. However, after nearly a decade of legal limbo, we are able to move on and begin the next season for St. Luke's. We have lost our land and buildings, which is a very costly price to pay. However, we believe that we simply followed Jesus and His Word. Whatever cost we pay for that is worthwhile. Scripture tells us that we won't always have riches on Earth, and that sometimes we will even suffer pain and persecution for following Jesus. Even now, there are Christians who are losing their lives, their freedom, and all their possessions as the cost of following Jesus in other countries. Here, we have lost a building.

I don't mean to minimize the personal loss, as we grieve. Many of you have moved out of homes that were filled with family memories. You remember, for example, raising children in a house that is not your own anymore. The loss of a building can be a painful process, and it can even feel like you are losing all the memories connected with that place. However, the value of a building, whether it is a home or a church building, is in the ongoing story it helps you create. You do not have to stay in the same house for the rest of your life to remember raising your children. More importantly, you can love your adult children now, because you raised them in that house back then. Similarly, our wonderful church building helped us live as God's family here in Merced. Some of you were spiritually raised at this address on Yosemite Ave, and some of you raised children here (both "your own" and other dear boys and girls who you helped raise in the faith over decades).

None of that ends because we lost the property. The story of St. Luke's Anglican church started long before we moved to Yosemite Ave, and it will continue long after. We will continue to love and support each other as God's people. We will continue to offer God's salvation to those in our community. We will continue to raise and support followers of Jesus Christ, seeking that everyone at St. Luke's continually grows in the love and knowledge of God. We will continue to be present for each other in the difficulty, grief, and challenges of life and death.

We do not know all the details of what that will look like. Our current estimate is that we have 6 months to a year to move, which gives us time to plan well. We also have options already in place so that we can move and continue as a church anytime we need to change. At this

time, we are waiting to hear the details of what property we will be able to bring with us, and what we have to leave behind. Please be patient and prayerful as we wait for all those details.

I am asking that every member of St. Luke's pray daily for this transition.

Please pray for the following:

- For courage and encouragement for every member of St. Luke's, as we face the challenges and opportunities of change
- For wisdom and discernment for the vestry and for me, as we make decisions about the future
- For good and healthy grieving over the loss of the property, including treasuring our memories here
- For God to use this transition for His glory and for the growth of St. Luke's; that we would deepen our faith through this struggle, become closer to each other by sharing this ordeal, and use our new beginning to reach new people in Merced.
