From the Pastor's Desk

In a few weeks, we will celebrate Thanksgiving. It is easy to focus on family and food for the holiday, with perhaps only a passing reference to thanking God for our blessings. This month, I would like to encourage all of us to focus on gratitude as a daily practice. Thanking God for His blessings is an act of worship, and when gratitude becomes a habit, we are formed into people of worship. Praising God in church is easy, but we need to carry praise into the world. We do that by taking every opportunity to identify things to praise God for, then practicing putting our gratitude into words. It can be as simple as seeing the sky on a beautiful day and saying, "thank you God." It can also be a time of longer prayer or journaling, as you think through the many blessings you have received. I keep using the word, "habit," because that is the really life-changing element of this. Feeling gratitude and praising God every now and then is wonderful. However, becoming a person who recognizes God's blessings and responds to them all throughout the day changes all of life. It is a cure for bitterness and self-centeredness. It will help you be more giving, more loving, and more happy. It will make prayer more natural and more joyful. When gratitude becomes a habit, you will discover (and remember) that you are more blessed than you ever imagined.

As on every Sunday, I am "preaching to myself" too here. I need and want to be more grateful, and I want thanksgiving to become a habit. Please join me this month in working to form the habit.

So, what I am grateful for?

I am grateful for the generosity and support of St. Luke's. You keep blessing Juliet and me in unexpected ways, and you have become dear to us in the last two years.

I am grateful for Juliet. I had waited a long time to marry, asking God to help me find a partner for life. He has blessed me through her, and I appreciate her daily love and friendship.
